

POLICY TITLE:	HARASSMENT
DATE:	February 2016

The Alberta Carriage Driving Association (ACDA) is committed to maintaining a welcoming, equal opportunity environment at all its events, and throughout its website and social media.

Accordingly, contravention of this policy will result in loss of membership, loss of advertising privileges, and/or removal from social media groups administered by the ACDA, at the discretion of the Board.

Harassment can take many forms.

1. **DEFINITIONS**:

- 1.1. **Online harassment** has a number of other names such as "cyber bullying" or "cyber stalking" and is conducted through the use of a computer and access to the Internet/social media. It refers to:
 - 1.1.1. Direct communication through email
 - 1.1.2. Internet harassment, where the offender publishes offensive or threatening information about the victim on the Internet or through social media
 - 1.1.3. The publishing or sending of intimate, provocative or sexual pictures or photos of an individual, regardless of whether such pictures were taken consensually
 - 1.1.4. Efforts through social media to instill anger or hate toward an individual from others on social media
 - 1.1.5. Unauthorized use, control or sabotage of the victim's computer.

1.2. Creating a Poisoned Sports Environment refers to:

A poisoned sports environment constitutes harassment, regardless of whether individuals complain or not. As with other forms of harassment, a poisoned sports environment denigrates an individual's equipment, equine, race, ethnic background, origin or record of offence. Contributing to a poisoned sports environment can occur at:

- Sporting events and competitions
- Training sessions and workshops
- Sport-related travel
- Over the telephone
- At the organization's business or social functions
- Meetings and conferences
- Anywhere a person happens to be as a result of sport-related relationships or responsibilities



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2. PROCESS:

A harassment complaint may be made through any method, in any format, to any member of the Board. That Board member will contact the President immediately to request a special teleconference, at which the complaint will be discussed. The Board will be asked to reach a unanimous conclusion on the action to be taken, which may include any or all of the following:

- 2.1. A discussion with, or letter to, the offending member
- 2.2. Loss of advertising privileges
- 2.3. Removal (and/or blocking) from social media groups administered by the ACDA
- 2.4. Loss of membership in the ACDA, which would entail loss of all associated privileges (voting, membership lists, participation in events, advertising, etc)
- 3. **DOCUMENTATION:** All harassment complaints submitted to the Board must be documented. The complainant and offender will receive copies of the decision.
